STUDENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS

Children **CAN** confidently bring their faith into public school and respectfully share and defend their faith.

- You have the right to **pray** at times that are not interrupting instruction.
- You have the right to **read your Bible** during non-instructional time or when free choice of reading material is given.
- You have the right to **wear clothing and jewelry** with religious messages or icons.
- You have the right to **listen to religious music** during non-instructional time.
- You have the right to **organize a religious club or prayer group**, following the same guidelines as other non-curricular clubs.
- You have the right to **pray and study the Bible with classmates** during non-instructional time.
- You have the right to **share your faith** with others of differing viewpoints.

STUDENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS

- You have the right to **distribute religious literature**, following the same guidelines as distribution of other non-curricular literature.
- You may be able to **leave school during school hours** for a religious class.
- You have the right to include your faith perspective in classroom assignments.
- You have the right to **discuss religious viewpoints**, similar to debating politics.
- You have the right to **express your faith at a school event**, like a talent show or graduation, as long as you retain control of the content.
